F.W. Delamain's colourful character and history is reflected in many of the street names throughout this subdivision, continuing the legacy of a part of our city already steeped in tradition.

FW Delamain Drive – the pioneering Cantabrian, pictured above

Roulet Lane – from the cognac house established by James Delamain that became Delamain family cognac business

Cognac Drive – the location where the famous drink is produced

Jacques Way – Jacques, the son of James Delamain, who carried on the family business

Vesper Lane – a variety of the famous Delamain cognac

Ferdinand Terrace – Henry-Ferdinand, the third generation Delamain to run the family cognac business

Philippe Avenue – Henrys-Ferdinand's son, the fourth generation cognac maker

Bernice Crescent – the granddaughter of F.W.

Albert Sheppard Close – relation of the last three generations of Canterbury landowners, the Georges

The Gate – a term given to the cellar doors where the cognac matures

Cellars Way – critical to the aging of the cognac

Famille Close – a brand name of Delamain Cognac: known as "Reserve de la Famille"

Jarnac Boulevard – the home of the much celebrated Cognac Brandy

Millesimes Way – another brand within the Delamain cognac range

Charente Way – named after 'Charente', the rolling countryside where James Delamain settled to start his family and the business

Champagne Avenue – the famous locale that is the heart of the cognac region
